



## Memorandum of Interview

## **Details:**

On August 8, 2015 and August 10, 2015, Reporting Investigator visited Scott Lombardo's residence in Dayton, Ohio. Attempts to interview Lombardo as his residence were met with negative results. On August 10, 2015 at 20:55 hours, Lombardo contacted Reporting Investigator from telephone number (937) 750-8711.

Lombardo described Wampler as being "weird". However, Lombardo did not give any detailed information regarding what was meant by that description. Reporting Investigator asked Lombardo about the report that Wampler masturbated in front of him (Lombardo). Lombardo responded by saying "it could have happened" and repeated that Wampler was weird. Lombardo said that he quit hanging out with Wampler because he was weird.

Lombardo stated that he lived six blocks from Wampler when Wampler resided on Dorothy Lane in Kettering, Ohio. Lombardo said that he knew Wampler for a period of six to eighteen months. Lombardo stated that Wampler and he drank and smoked marijuana during this time. Lombardo described his own marijuana use as "heavy" and that he was high most of the time.

Reporting Investigator read the Moraine Police Report, Case 82-184, dated 06/10/1982, to Lombardo. In the report, Detective Mullins

stated that Lombardo discussed the masturbation incident and that Wampler carried a knife. Lombardo stated that he does not remember talking to the police. Reporting Investigator told Lombardo that in the report, Dennis Langer, Assistant Prosecutor, Montgomery County Prosecutor's Office, ordered that Lombardo be brought to the prosecutor's office. Lombardo said that he does not remember that ever happening, but does not dispute it either. When Reporting Investigator asked how he could not remember talking to the police or going to the prosecutor's office, Lombardo's response was, "I was high most of the time."

The interview ended under unfavorable conditions.

Investigator's Note: Lombardo was evasive throughout the interview. When pushed for details, his response was either, "I was high most of the time" or "It was 33 years ago." Apparently, being questioned by the police regarding a murder suspect and then being taken to the prosecutor's office did not leave an impression on a 15 year old Lombardo because he cannot remember an event that significant.
